



ICT MANAGERS (ANZSCO: 1351)

ICT Managers plan, organise, direct, control and coordinate the acquisition, development, maintenance and use of computer and telecommunication systems within organisations.

Employment

Employment for this occupation rose very strongly (in percentage terms) in the past five years and rose strongly in the long-term (ten years). Looking forward, employment for ICT Managers to November 2020 is expected to grow very strongly.

Unemployment

Unemployment for ICT Managers is average.

Job openings

Over the five years to November 2019, the number of job openings for ICT Managers is expected to be above average (between 25,001 and 50,000). Job openings count both employment growth and turnover (defined as workers leaving their occupation for other employment or leaving the workforce).

Educational profile

The most common level of educational attainment for ICT Managers is Bachelor degree (32.5 per cent).

Gender

The female share of ICT Managers is 22.7 per cent and 94.8 per cent of ICT Managers work full time. Average weekly hours for full time workers are 41.2 (compared to 40.2 for all occupations).

Age profile

The main age group is 35-44 years (39.8 per cent) and the median age is 42 years (compared to 40 years for all occupations).

Earnings

In August 2014 (latest available data) weekly earnings full-time before tax (and not including employer superannuation) were \$2,233 (compared to earnings for all occupations of \$1,200).

Industries

ICT Managers are mainly employed in: Professional, Scientific and Technical Services; Information Media and Telecommunications; and Financial and Insurance Services.
